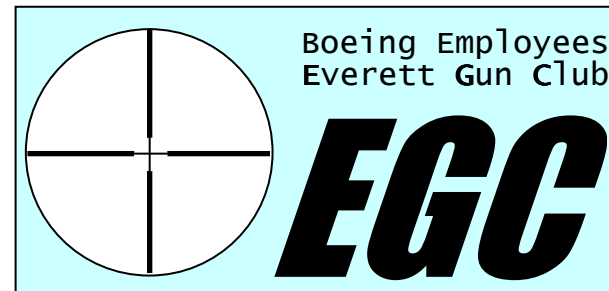
FIREARM SAFETY

Training

The club offers training and education courses for both pistol and rifle. Each course is taught by NRA certified instructors and club training staff. Classes are generally kept small (< 12 students) to ensure individual instruction and coaching.

Courses are open to all Boeing employees, retirees, contractors, customers, and families thereof. Cost of each class is \$60 for club members (\$80 for Basic Personal Protection) and \$80 for non-members (\$100 for Basic Pers. Prot.).

NRA Basic Pistol (10 hrs): This course teaches the essential safety rules and basic skills for those wanting to learn how to shoot a pistol. Students learn pistol function, parts, and safe ownership and operation. Safety, both at home and at the range, is strongly emphasized.

Basic Personal Protection (18.5 hrs): This course teaches the knowledge, attitude, and skills necessary for the safe defensive use of handguns. It includes classroom preparation, range exercises, and discussions with both an attorney and a law enforcement officer. This class is also an excellent opportunity to learn skills needed for action pistol events. The course also introduces the student to other self-defense concepts beyond and in addition to the use of a firearm. Completion of the Basic Pistol course is recommended before taking this class.

Basic Rifle (14 hrs): This course is designed for beginning shooters or those wanting to enhance their safety and marksmanship. It features the .22 rifle and precision airgun and covers the essentials of rifle safety, basic marksmanship, rifle operation, ammunition, rifle storage and cleaning. Parents must accompany children under the age of 18. Note: This is not a Hunter's Ed. Class but can enhance the knowledge gained from that program.

Membership Information

Eligibility
